1972.178.1	coat hanger stand	Coat hanger stand with integrated umbrella stand: dark stained wood square base with five feet (one is extension of centre post); base is divided into quadrants by four wooden leaves that form the umbrella stand, each quadrant has a large hole cut-out in the centre and a chain wraps around hanging from upper corner of each leaf; square centre pole has four metal coat hanger hooks top, one on each face. From old City Hall. Council Chambers.	
1972.188.2a-j	Cabinet	a) Solid oak cabinet with dark finish, carved foliage and feline heads, finials and barley-twist columns. Shelved section on PR side with four loose shelves, d) to g), enclosed behind glass door. Three drawers, h) to j) on PL side and pigeon hole with drop-down writing slab above. Above this is an enclosed shelf with mirror and a smaller cupboard with curved glass door. b1) Wooden pigeon hole insert, handmade with horizontal and vertical compartments, pen holders at the sides and a drawer, b2). c) Small steel key with a pierced, trefoil head. ca. 1910	
1974.25.2	scale	Metal and wooden platform weighing scales on wheels. A wooden upright post houses the ends of the metal arm and weigh beam which extend out and display the sliding weight and weight holder. Extending from the front of the post is a metal loop (flat stock) which has 3 iron weights hanging off of it, there are 5 in total, 2 remain on the platform - iron weights range between (1,-5 pounds) Wood is used as housing, finish and as part of the platform to weigh.	
1974.26.1	buffet	Glossy, off-white wooden kitchen "Buffett" (sic) cabinet with art deco-style curves. Two drawers and a central cupboard with one shelf and two glass doors decorated with a red linear design. Silver-coloured metal handles (six in total) are grooved and have red plastic inserts, ca. 1941	

1974.54.4	chair	Stained and varnished oak arm chair with black leather seat. Top rail and back-splat are flat with a shaped profile, seat is fixed with steel tacks, arms are shaped with slight curve and fixed to sides of seat, front legs are shaped with a slight curve and carved with a claw foot at the base. Stretchers on all sides	
1974.54.5	chair	Wooden kitchen chair, with round, Windsor style hoop back with four rungs (or spindles), and turned legs fixed slightly at an outward angle; two stretchers on each side, seat has rounded corners and tapers slightly back.	
1974.84.4	stool	Small wooden (oak?) stool: round seat with four turned legs slightly angled outward, top of legs have seven rings; one stretcher on two sides, two on the others;	
1975.13.1	plant stand	Square-topped mahogany wood plant stand. Top has a bevelled edge with decorative molding, the pillar is turned and the base is square with four slightly shaped feet. Stained and varnished finish.	

1975.56.1	chair	Dark-stained, varnished oak chair. Deep top rail with scroll detail at top corners and carved acanthus design at sides, twelve bannisters, molded seat, serpentine front apron, cabriole legs at the front. From the City of North Vancouver, ca. 1910.	
1975.56.2	chair	Dark-stained, varnished oak chair. Deep top rail with scroll detail at top corners and carved acanthus design at sides, twelve bannisters, molded seat, serpentine front apron, cabriole legs at the front. From the City of North Vancouver, ca. 1910.	
1975.8.4	lectern	Wooden lectern, composed of a book rest with a lip. Main column has curved scrolled supports under the book rest and at the base. The wood is stained dark brown, and there is moulding on the three sides away from the reader. Front of the base is cut shorter than the rest which are uniform.	
1975.82.55	box	Rectangular cedar box with hinged lid, exterior stained dark brown and varnished with rounded corners, interior unfinished. Small, plastic, oval recesses in the sides for handling. Three small metal loop-shaped fixtures in the front but no lock.	

1975.82.57	table	Square, dark-stained and varnished wood table. Molding attached to underside of table top, four cabriole legs and decoratively shaped shelf which attaches to each leg.	
1976.5.120	radio console	General Electric radio model E-98 serial number 702: vertical format, rectangular, brown, wood radio with a polished wood cabinet. The top is flat, the front edges are rounded, and the back edges are squared. Dial faces are set into slanting front section. Dial face is glass-covered, with brass edging, and a lower extension that shows the second dial. Dial shows short, medium and long wave, plus standard and fine tuning. Below dial is five plastic knobs. Lower section of the radio has a speaker grill. Made by Canadian General Electric, North America, Canada. Donated by Patterson Estate.	
1977.111.1	utility pole	Utility pole and 12 glass insulators. a) Wooden cross arm beam with 12 threaded metal receptacles for the glass insulators and 2 threaded wooden pegs. b) to m) Clear glass insulators, bell-shaped with a rounded top and narrow neck, a metal thread is inserted inside the neck for screwing onto the rod. Inscribed "Armstrong's CSC MADE IN U.S.A. 23 47". Taken from Grouse Mountain in 1977. (parts b-m located Warehouse:East Mezzanine:U46:S6)	
1977.142.1	piano	An upright piano with glossy dark finish. The piano has a hinged lid at the top and two brass candle holders attached to the front face. A hinged cover closes over the keyboard.	

1977.161.5a-b	floor lamp	Bridge lamp with cast iron top; a) round metal base with six feet, grooved post with swivel arm on top; metal socket for light bulb with pull chain; plastic electrical cord attached to base; b) lamp shade printed fabric: blue and brown geometrical floral pattern with gold paper trim; wire clip to fasten to light bulb. ca. 1935	
1978.118.1	platform scale	Platform scale for weighing students: medical office-style light green scale with platform and pedestal with adjustable weight bar and vertical height scale; metal brace stabilizes vertical post; two oval stickers front pole.	
1978.74.30	floor lamp	Black wrought iron Bridge lamp	
1978.74.31	floor lamp	Wrought iron bridge lamp: single rod in the centre, three flat wrought iron legs curl under at the bottom and a leaf design where they attack to the centre rod; swivel arm is straight flat piece of wrought iron that curls around at one end and holds lampshade and bulb on the other; black extension cord extends from top of lamp through swivel arm and then hangs, brown plastic two prong plug attached.	
1979.62.1	jack	Buda 15 Ton heavy cast iron jack, for lifting rails to replace ties: L-shaped pedestal with handle shafts encases lift bar; handle is broken; embossed on both sides with manufacturer's name	

1980.134.5	cooking stove	RIPPINGILLES SENIOR RALCBLU portable, enamelled steel liquid fuel stove. Stove a) has an off-white and black metal stand on four straight legs, three burners with cylindrical casings b) to d) at the base which connect to a glass fuel tank. Ca. 1920	
1980.138.1	chair	Tub-shaped wicker chair with very firm, twisted weave. Bamboo legs, cross-piece and supports are all wrapped with wicker. Seat is round with a spiral weave and a deep front apron. Back has diamond-shaped motif in the centre, a wide edge with three V-shaped designs and supports on each side at the back. Feet are reinforced with brass collars. From North Vancouver home. ca. 1930	
1980.148.31	laundry tubs	Pair of enamelled steel laundry tubs on a black steel stand with castors. Tubs are mottled black and white on the inside, white on the outside and have hexagonal plug holes with short, tapped pipes attached on the ca. 1940. From home at 1341 Plateau Dr., North Vancouver.	
1980.148.32	radio console	Rogers Combination Model 680 console, dark wooden cabinet on four turned feet, flip-top phonograph, front decorated with several relief panels, sliding door open front to reveal radio tuner, control knobs and speaker; sides are plain, back has wire mesh panel for equipment ventilation. ca. 1929. noted as "From N.V. Home" at 1341 Plateau Dr.	
1980.170.1	heater	cast iron drum heater, 2 pieces, door side: "Lumberman" in raised lettering, door marked: "McLennan McFeely & Co. Lim Vancouver BC"; barrel is light blue; heater stands on four cast iron legs, back cast iron plate has vent hole. front and back of drum heater dug up in 1975 at the second camp site of Capilano Timber. in water shed of North Vancouver.	

1980.35.6	wheelbarrow	Wood and metal open wheelbarrow. The base and back are constructed from wooden slats and the back is reinforced with iron straps. The shaped wooden handles form the main frame to which curved iron leg rests and an axle for the cast iron front wheel are attached. ca. 1940	
1981.76.1a	pump organ	a) Dominion pump organ with mouseproof pedals: dark wood cabinet with lift up locking cover and side handles; all ivory and ebony keys in place; no backing behind keyboard, written in key extensions "Vocal range E flat to F sharp"; action level below keyboard; two metal frame pedals have heavily worn carpet with red pattern (floral?); back closed by two grey plywood boards (possibly later addition/repair?). b) Brass key with triangular shaft and oval head with figure-8 cut-out. c) Rectangular, copper-coloured plastic key-tag with small brass chain, tag is embossed with inscription "Fly TCA" and image of a maple leaf and plane. This article was given to Laura McWilliams by an elderly lady in 1970. This lady was Ada Garter and had lived in North Vancouver for	
1982.11.4	heating stove	Black, cylindrical heater with an oval flue and a white enamelled plaque at the top with the manufacturer's name "EMPIRE" in black. The base, hearth, lid and four legs are cast iron and the drum is sheet steel with an asbestos liner. Ca. 1925.	
1982.17.4	side table	Small varnished wooden table: square top with corners squared off at 45° angle, legs are screwed to edge of board at these corners and sit proud of table top; two square cross braces at approximately 12.0 cm from floor. Ca. 1927	

1983.100.26	birdcage stand	Yellow birdcage metal stand: Round metal base, centred two part tubular stand with wire form shaped to fit a birdcage fitted on top; J-hook at top of frame to hang cage.	
1983.35.1	weathervane	Handmade tall steel weathervane with an ornate, cast-iron base and four metal disc attachments. Ca. . Made by donor Rod Cameron	
1988.106.1	crib	Baby crib with off-white painted steel frame and mattress. Ca. 1925	
1988.15.1	barber's chair	A red and white barber chair. The chair is made of wood and sits on a white enameled metal stand with foot rest. A small black headrest is attached to the top of the back of the chair. Ca. 1930. original cataloguer notes: Chair was picked up by the Musuem director in 1975 near Sears Capilano Mall from an old war time house. It has been in the warehouse since then. Delivery receipt: "Thought to be from NV Commercial establishment."	

1988.24.2	turnstile	Rectangular, silver-coloured metal turnstile with a "T"-shaped slot in the top and attached rotating sprocket with three metal arms. Sprocket-head and concave side of turnstile are painted green. From North Vancouver City Ferry	
1988.37.1	jail	Silver painted metal jail cell block incomplete and in sections, some extra parts of another cell or will be worked on to make one complete cell block: grid of structural components made from steel bars 0.5 cm thick and 3.8 cm wide fixed at each crossing with a steel rivet; bed grids are made from lighter material and rivetted at the edges only; solid elements made from angle and metal sheets attached to them. Found at 209 W. 4th St., used for Juvenile Detention.	
1988.44.1a-b	chairs	Wooden ladderback chairs with a woven rush seat. Three back rails, turned stiles with spheres at the top, turned front legs and side and front stretchers. One painted red, one painted blue. Ca. 1935	
1988.44.3	floor lamp	Floor lamp with nature motif: round wooden base on metal stand with four feet resembling paws/claws; ornamented post in two sections with central fitting, at bottom of pole has seahorse figures, at top a cast iron(?) cut-out(?) frieze with two birds, three candelabras evenly distributed on top with cardboard sheaths on sockets and candle-like lightbulbs, each with a small shade on one side; shades are decorated and have cord trim; cloth sheath in electrical cord. ca. 1930. From North Vancouver home, may have been purchased second hand 1937	

1988.50.5	radio console	Sparton Console Radio with removable back. Model 931; Serial No. B79755, walnut, doors open front to reveal radio tuner, control knobs and speaker; back comes off to reveal electronic equipment. Ca. 1929. Donated by Estate of S.E.W. Brown-John. From N.V. home of donor's parents.	
1989.19.2	sink	An orange sink and cabinet unit with grey counter top. There is a large cabinet door at the front and an electrical outlet on the side. The sink has a tall curved faucet with a single knob for water control. There is a pair of lab spouts, each with their own water control, on either side of the sink. ca. 1950. From North Vancouver High School	
1989.34.3	floor lamp	Metal floor lamp with white gloss finish and round, molded base. There is a balanced-arm section with three joints at the top of the lamp. The plastic shade is broken and missing parts, it holds sockets for two bulbs but only one is in place. A grey electrical cord is attached to the bottom of the central support.	
1989.36.3	cabinet	Dark wooden cabinet on four legs with light coloured drawers: dark wood frame adapted to hold 20 hand-made, numbered drawers of various sizes; drawers have a thin eyering stapled over an oval indentation as handles, not all square nor all bottoms are one piece; four sets of holes on sides possibly for door hinges. ca. 1940	
1993.2.1	heating stove	Black cast iron "FRANKLIN No 14" wood stove with two sets of sliding doors at front an oval flue at the back and four cabriole-shaped legs. Decorated with spiral, fan and floral design on face, legs and top. Circular lid which sits on top. Cast iron lid lifter with steel open spiral handle, attached to stove with a chain. There is also a separate front grate section which is not numbered. ca. 1930	

1993.3.1	time recording clock	Not in Past Perfect. According to accession file this object was deaccessioned in September 1995.	
1996.34.1b	school desk	Wood and cast iron student's desk, beige painted cast iron parts, wood work appears to be newly finished, ink well hole filled in, "C.O. & School Furniture Co.". Removed from Grandview School, Vancouver, BC, in 1974.	
2004.12.1	television	Large "PHILIPS" television in a glass-fronted, varnished, wooden case which rotates on a three-legged, steel stand. Case has four plastic control knobs and a which are mounted on a fabric coated board. The back of the case holds a perforated sheet of particle board which has a small cardboard box protruding from it. There are a number of sticker and instructions printed on the back board. Belonged to Eva Jensen, Danish immigrant to North Vancouver in 1957.	
2012.INV.193	trunk	Rectangular steel trunk with remnants of black paint layer, a rounded, hinged lid, C-shaped handles at the sides and a hasp and staple lock at the front. Trunk has raised seams on all sides and two thicker straps on the lid. The interior is bare metal with a copper coloured finish and two triangular brackets spanning the front corners which are missing from the back. Remnants of a paper labels on three sides, largely illegible except front label which reads "ST. JOHN. N.B".	
2013.INV.753	time recording clock	A tall, upright standing punch or time recording clock to record employee work hours. Dark wooden case with a glass door looking in on inner gears/cogs of time clock. "GLOBE CARD RECORDER / W A. WOOD / MONTREAL". Gold, black and white interior and an ornate base in front with scrolled and embossed metal with levers for changing time, etc. on punching into or out of work with "GLOBE CARD RECORDER" with slot for inserting card.	

2014.18.2	sofa	Teak two-seater sofa with six legs and four loose cushions covered with blue, woven wool (or wool blend) upholstery. Frame is largely rectilinear but seat and back are at a slight angle. Armrests are wide and rounded at the edges with a visible mortice join at the front. Back cushions are supported with three cross rails and the seat cushions with interwoven strips of rubber webbing. from office of Dr Bryan E. Reid, dentist, at 1548 Lonsdale since 1958 to 2003.	
2014.19.1	sewing machine	Willcox & Gibbs sewing machine in wooden table with three lateral drawers with brass hardware and removable cover: machine is almost circular with gold floral pattern, spool of white thread is threaded on machine; cast iron legs and pedal have multiple embossed patent dates on them; table top has a folding extension on one side, three locking drawers on the other, sections that hold locks have been removed and are in top drawer; cover is rectangular, panelled sides and moulding on top, printed inside is manufacturer's name and logo; inside drawers multiple accessories and parts such as needles, oiler and instruction	
2014.25.2	armchairs	Pair of teak armchairs with yellow leather-effect upholstery, made by Davis and Chine. Frame is rectilinear with stretchers at the sides and dark, wooden plugs in the screw holes on the stile. Back, seat and arm rails are upholstered with additional buttoned cushions attached to the back and seat. The underside of the seat is covered with a loosely woven brown dust cover and a black and silver manufacturers plate is attached to the inside of the back rail.	
2014.25.3	office chair	Varnished oak swivel office chair with black leather upholstery on the back (damaged) and a shaped seat. Upholstery is trimmed with black tape and secured with black-coated steel tacks. Back has a short back splat and rounded top rail which attaches to arms which are carved in a scroll shape at the front and base. Seat attaches to a metal mechanism with two springs and screws for adjusting the height and tilt resistance of the chair. Mechanism attaches to a curved cross-frame base with four rubber castors attached.	

2014.INV.505	bridge table	Square green table with folding legs: top is a light coloured wooden frame with green paper covered cardboard top wrapped around edges, top has thin reinforcing wooden bar centred below, four dark coloured folding square long wooden legs affixed to each corner with a silvertone metal fitting.	
INV0582	radiator	five cylinder hot water heater, very rusted and paint peeling off. Height 89cm, width 39cm, depth 7.5cm	
INV1217	piston	One large piston with seven ring grooves between pin holes and curved end, one ring groove between pin holes and piston head; set of 16 piston rings (not individually numbered).	
INV1298	school desks	Row of three school desks with black-painted cast iron frames, wooden desktops and folding wooden seats. Each desk has a globe and ribbon design reading "GLOBE/ WATERLOO ONT." at the top of the frame on each side and the number "4" embossed below. The desks sit on two black wooden supports. Made by Globe, North America, Ontario, Waterloo	
INV1405	heating stove	Cast iron box style heating stove on four removable feet, very ornate with fish motif; top has two removable sections: larger rectangular lid with smaller round engraved one; front has an extension with embossed removable cover, removable door is hinged with circular adjustable air intake vent; top back oval vent to connect to chimney; contains large amounts of ashes inside. Removable parts not numbered
