**Interested in documentation and its application in heritage conservation and management?
Interested to know why we record, how we select the appropriate method(s), and what is the appropriate level of details in documentation?**

Athabasca University's Heritage Resources Management Program in partnership with St. Albert Arts and Heritage Foundation will host a week-long workshop on **Documentation and Condition Assessment** starting August 12, 2019. Workshop participants will have the opportunity to gain hands-on experiences working in groups and as part of team on historic sites in St. Albert (Alberta, Canada). The participants will explore the application of various documentation methods, from hand recording to 3D Scanning, to investigate, document, and record the existing physical forms and condition of heritage resources.

Dr. Mario Santana Quintero, associate professor of Architectural Conservation and Sustainability at Carleton University, will lead the workshop.

Dr. Santana Quintero is the Vice-President of ICOMOS and serves as an ICOMOS Canada Board member. He is the past president of the ICOMOS Scientific Committee on Heritage Documentation (CIPA). He has collaborated in several international projects in the field of heritage documentation for UNESCO, the Getty Conservation Institute, ICCROM, and the World Monuments Fund among others.
