## Why present?

There is a breadth of knowledge and experience in the Lower Mainland. The LMME conference depends on our community to participate. Each different organization and individuals within them bring unique perspectives, challenges, and solutions to the collective struggles we as a community face. We'd love to hear from you.

Proposals might focus on things like: Where are our facilities headed/where do we want to be, and what paths we might take to get there. Experimenting and prototyping. Efforts made to change, that failed (or didn't work out quite right). Launch pads for future work. Places for "people like me" (representation). How to welcome/reach new audiences. Steps to creating an ongoing culture within organizations that is truly welcoming. Creating meaning & engagement.

The deadline for submissions is October 1st, 2019.

#### Presentation types:

- Ignite: A to-the-point, five minute presentation followed by a long discussion period. This session helps to create dialogue, foster learning, and is fun for all. Usually, the slides are timed and automatically advance: 20 slides of 15 seconds each.
- Workshop: Plan a hands-on, kinesthetic, or practical session that fills most of your time period. Share tools, practice skills, and make it memorable.
- Panel: Two or more speakers share the time equally, reflecting on topics that complement each other. Plan for a longer Q&A session to interact with the audience.
- Individual Presentation: The session time is spent on one speaker and topic, followed by a short Q&A period. Share complex or sensitive topics in this type of presentation.
- Something else? We are open to ideas!

All sessions will be 25 or 50 minutes long.
