



There are two tracked extensions that attach at the front and rear of the camera body to allow for the full extension of the bellows. The front extension track is stamped "132" the rear extension track is stamped "122". "NOV 15 '04" patent date on one part.

There is a lighter coloured wood lens board. The back piece comes off, has translucent glass panel; with rubber flasher and light focus.

There is a canvas carrying case.

The camera body is made from cardboard and covered with black textured paper to imitate leather. There is a black tape patch on the back of the camera and another tape patch on one edge of a viewfinder. There is no leather handle on the top of the camera.

Two clips and the film advance knob hold the front of the camera in the body of the camera. There are two viewfinders, one for portrait and the other for landscape use. The lens is in the centre of the camera front. The shutter release is on the right side in portrait mode. There is a pull lever on the top to change the shutter release from automatic to manual timing.

There is a round red glass viewer allowing the photographer to see when the film has been advanced to the next frame. A number on the film appears in the glass. The makers details and type of film to use is embossed on the back of the camera.
