Getting ready to Zoom

Zoom is a video conferencing service that allows lots of folks to tune in to huge videoconferencing calls. It's how we'll be delivering the lectures for this series.

Joining Zoom on your laptop/PC:

1. Email Kody Huard (khuard@musqueam.bc.ca) requesting a meeting invite and Kody will send you an invite that includes information (also listed below) as well as a clickable link that will open zoom for you if clicked.
2. Open Zoom (either the program if you have downloaded it or click [here](#) to open it in your web browser). Meeting ID and Password are below.

Password:	NONE, you will be admitted to a digital waiting room and your admittance to the meeting will be approved (hang tight!)

Joining Zoom on your smartphone:

If you're using your smartphone to zoom, you should install the application from the app store first, then from the app you can type in the meeting ID above.

Joining Zoom via (audio) phone:

You can call into a Zoom meeting using the phone number below, you won't be able to see the presentation or presenter but will be able to hear everything. If you call in please make sure to mute your phone.

Lecture Etiquette

Because we're expecting large numbers of attendees, and things can get quite raucous in a big zoom call, we'll be asking you to follow some simple zoom etiquette.

Please arrive a few minutes early. We will be starting the lectures on time so please log onto Zoom 5 or so minutes early to make sure you have access and any bugs are sorted out. You will be placed in a digital waiting room until the lecture starts.

Please mute your mic and disable your video when the presenter is speaking. These will be turned off by default, and can be turned on/off using the icons in the lower left part of your screen. The icons will say “Join Audio” or “Mute Audio” / “Join Video” or “Stop Video.” Please press mute and stop to ensure no background noise takes over the call.

There may times when we want to break the meeting into smaller groups to discuss things from the presentation. In this event, the host will divide up the participants into break out rooms. At this point please turn on your video/microphone so you can chat if you like. Once your group is ready to leave the room, feel free to do so. Alternatively, one of the hosts can end the room if you run out of time.
