Brief description of the study:

We are currently seeking participants for a research study on museum quiet spaces. These are spaces with reduced noise and activity for visitors to step away from the museum exhibits, slow down, and take a moment to relax and regroup. These spaces are emerging in museums across Canada, but as of yet there is little research on them.

Participants will be asked their thoughts and opinions about the purpose and use of quiet spaces in museums. Interviews are confidential, and participants are free to withdraw from the study at any time.
